Open Minutes

Moles moved to accept the minutes from the July 19, 2021 meeting as written. Ellena seconded.

2021/2022 Budget

Moles moved to approve the \$8.00 monthly increase in carrying charges for the 2021/2022 budget. Heist seconded.

Property Cameras

Management presented the figures for a cost comparison of the bids from Johnson Control and Security Pros.

Due to the cost, Moles moved not to purchase security cameras for the property in all the parking lots. James seconded. Members can buy cameras for the front and/or back of their townhome, if they choose.

Toro Repair

Management said that one of the Toros needs to be repaired. Last week, Ramon approved Spartan Distributors to do the repairs totalling \$4,691.47. By consensus, the Board agreed to the repairs. Next year, it may be necessary to purchase a new Toro. The cost will be between \$45,000 to \$50,000. Consensus 5-0.

Light Pole on Miller

Recently, one of the light poles on Miller was hit with the mower along the pine trees. These are mowed around each week and the mower is wearing into the structure of the poles. The ground staff has suggested building a concrete box (6" to 8") around the existing poles and the new pole to protect them when mowing. Thee Electric has given Highlands an amount of \$3,288 to replace the damaged pole (including concrete).

Management is getting a bid from Thelen Concrete for the bases for the other light poles on Miller. This is the same company that does other concrete jobs around the property and are always the lowest bid. It might be next year before the other light poles have the concrete bases completed. This is in section 4 lot 10.

Moles moved to use Thee Electric to replace the damaged pole and concrete base at the cost of \$3,288. James seconded.

Motion Carried 5-0.
